Key Points

- Though, COVID-19 is disrupting communities, schools, and routines, many Americans think their local schools have responded well to the crisis. Parents, feel prepared to facilitate e-learning and many would actually prefer to continue e-learning options for their children next year over them physically going into school.
- Americans' opinions on the direction of education are higher for local and state school districts, than nationwide. Also, Americans think that grades K-8 should prioritize core academics and grades 9-12 should focus on skills for future employment. Teachers and principals are trusted most to make good decisions, while state and federal agencies have higher levels of mistrust.
- Americans are unaware on annual school spending and teacher salary information, many believe both are much less than they actually are. With information on teacher salary, this month the amount of Americans that believe teachers' salaries should increase once given information on what they are actually paid has decreased since April.
- Respondents are much more likely to support school choice policies once given information. Black Americans are twice as likely to prefer charter schools when cost and transportation are non-factors.

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Methodology (also see slides 42 - 44)

This poll was conducted from May 14 - 15, 2020, among a national sample of 2,200 adults. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of adults based on age, race/ethnicity, gender, educational attainment, and region.




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Local schools are seen as having the best response to coronavirus, over other local and national institutions.






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The majority of school parents are more favorable of homeschooling as a result of the coronavirus.

How have your opinions on homeschooling changed as a result of the coronavirus?






COVID-19 Impact on Homeschooling



Likelihood of e-Learning Enrollment



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Returning to School in August/September

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
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Most parents expect students will return to school in August/September, however, they are split on their comfort level with their children returning to school at that time.


Expect Students Will Return to School

Do you feel things in K-12 Education are generally going in the right direction, or do you feel things have generally gotten off on the wrong track?



% Right Direction



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
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Americans believe teachers are most responsible for their school's performance, while elected officials and school boards are most responsible at the district level. School principals are viewed as responsible for both school and district performance.

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

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


Trust in Education Decision Makers

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
Satisfaction with Schooling


School Spending Estimate

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
School Funding



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
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With information on how much is spent annually per student liberals "too low" responses dropped 26 points – from 65% to 39%.


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With information the percentage of Americans that believe school funding is "too low" drops 23 points -- from 54% to 31%.



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
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
In line with school funding, median estimates on teacher salaries are much lower than any state's average.

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



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




















Standardized Testing




Standardized Testing




Standardized Testing

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Charter School Favorability


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All demographics experienced a lift in support for charter schools once given a description, especially Non-parents, Democrats and Independents.


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Like with charter schools, once respondents were given a description on school vouchers there is a significant lift in support.


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Respondent support for ESAs jumps from moderate to high once given a description.




