*Methodology:*

This poll was conducted between February 10-February 17, 2021 among a national sample of 1100 School Parents. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of School Parents based on age, gender, educational attainment, race, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percentage points.
