Crosstabulation Results

Methodology:

This poll was conducted between February 22-February 24, 2021 among a national sample of 1000 Teens. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Teens based on gender, age, race, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percentage points.
