Crosstabulation Results

Methodology:

This poll was conducted between March 11-March 23, 2021 among a national sample of 1164 School Parents. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of School Parents based on gender, educational attainment, age, race, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percentage points.
