Crosstabulation Results

Methodology:

This poll was conducted between February 12-February 15, 2022 among a sample of 1092 School Parents. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of School Parents based on gender, educational attainment, age, race, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percentage points.
