#### **Key Points**

- While the coronavirus outbreak continues to be disruptive to everyday life, Americans feel schools have responded well to the crisis. Parents are comfortable administrating elearning and most would prefer to enroll their children in an e-learning program in August/September over them physically going to school. However, there is increased concern over children missing the physical activities and free/reduced meal offerings that are provided by their schools.
- Parents of children in grades K-4 are more likely to believe they are experiencing racial biases than parents of children in grades 9-12. Parents that believe their children are facing inequalities believe any actions taken to address and reduce racial bias will be effective.
- Americans are more likely to believe their local schools are on the right track, while they are less optimistic when it comes to other schools in their state or schools nationwide. Also, Americans regardless of what grade believe that schools should encourage independent thinking. Principals are viewed as responsible for both schools and school districts, and teachers are most responsible for schools.
- Americans believe that schools are spending much less than they actually are annually per student and think teachers make less than they actually do. Once given information on annual spend per student Americans are more likely to believe that schools are spending the right amount, this is especially true among Moderates. However, when given information on teachers' salaries the amount of Americans that think their salaries should increase declines.

#### Methodology (also see slides 55 - 56)

This poll was conducted from June 12-14, 2020, among a national sample of 2,200 adults. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of adults based on age, race/ethnicity, gender, educational attainment, and region.

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

Based on what you have seen, read, or heard so far, how would rate the following institutions on their response to the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak?



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







How have your opinions on homeschooling changed as a result of the coronavirus?











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










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### Inequities children face









Do you feel things in K-12 Education are generally going in the right direction, or do you feel things have generally gotten off on the wrong track?





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



How much information about education, if any, do you get from the following sources?




# Trust in Education Decision Makers

How much, if at all, do you trust the following to make good decisions about education?






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Satisfaction with Charter Schools dropped since March (-17 points), however satisfaction with other types of schooling has remained steady since February.

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
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### Americans median estimate of annual school spending is less than the actual mean of school spending per student.



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

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



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

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

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



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
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# The percentage of Americans that believe teachers' salaries should increase once given the average annual salary for teachers in their state drops especially among Moderates (-23 point decrease).




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
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
# Respondents living in more remote community types like small towns or rural areas are more likely to prefer homeschooling than those living in more central community types.


















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## Like with charter schools, respondents remain more supportive of school vouchers when given information on what they are.

A school voucher system allows parents the option of sending their child to the school of their choice, whether that school is public or private, including both religious and non-religious schools. 
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## Respondent support across various demographic groups, for ESAs remains higher once given a description.


